# THE GLASS HOUSE




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# INVESTMENT

For those considering purchasing a lodge with Langtoft Lakes as an investment we have two options for your consideration, whilst these are negotiable they centre around the main points listed below.

## OPTION 1

The buyer can choose to receive an 8% return on their purchase in the first 5 years paid quarterly in arrears. The lodge would be rented through us via Hoseasons and would have to be available for rental year round meaning this option is best suited to those who do not wish to stay in their lodge. With this option Langtoft Lakes will cover all the costs of preparing the lodge for guests.

EXAMPLE: If you were to purchase a lodge for £300,000 you would receive £24,000 yearly in the first 5 years. (This may be extended, conditions apply)

## OPTION 2

Hoseasons have forecast a great return on our lodges. This option provides you with the flexibility to stay in your lodge at pre-booked times whilst also renting with Hoseasons via Langtoft Lakes. Running costs and fees associated with preparing the lodge for guests would be payable by you.

## **1. HOLDING DEPOSIT**

A £5,000 holding deposit secures your chosen plot (and lodge) for up-to 24 days. This can be paid by:

- Personal cheque
- Cash
- Bank Transfer

## 2. DESIGNING OF LODGE

We will go to the showground with you to help finalise the plans to your dream home.

## 3. RAISE THE REMAINING FIRST HALF OF THE DEPOSIT

After we have received the 50% we will then commence the works needed to ready your lodge for "Handover" (decking the home, etc.)

## 4. PAYMENT OF THE REMAINDER OF THE BALANCE

The full remaining balance of your deposit needs to be paid in cleared funds on the day of completion via Bankers Draft or Debit Card bank transfer.

- If you are paying the balance by cheque then we will require payment 7 day prior to the completion date.
- If paying via bank transfer this will need to be sent 3 days prior to the completion date.

# THE LOCAL AREA

#### LANGTOFT & BASTON

Langtoft is a small village with a thriving community spirit. This pretty village offers a rural way of life within easy access to all the amenities that modern living requires.

Baston plays host to several popular annual events including a 1940's event and Bonfire Festival. The village boasts two excellent public houses both with enviable reputations for serving top quality food and drink.

The villages are on the A15 road and are about 10 miles from the City of Peterborough and 8 miles from the historic Georgian town of Stamford. Nearby market towns of Bourne and Market Deeping add to the rural feel of the area.

#### STAMFORD

Previously voted one of the best places to live in the UK by the Sunday Times, Stamford boasts magnificent Georgian architecture, niche shopping, beautiful riverside meadows, prestigious local food and a vibrant Arts Centre.

Stamford is the most complete stone town in England with whole streets unchanged over the centuries and 600 listed mellow limestone buildings.

Home to Burghley House and its magnificent parklands, filled with ancient trees and a fallow deer herd which traces its ancestry right back to the sixteenth century. The grounds of Burghley House are a delight to stroll around and there are regular events held within the grounds.

## BOURNE

Renowned for its open spaces, parks and woodland and with 71 listed buildings, Bourne has a charm all of its own.

Bourne's Heritage Museum, Baldocks Mill is the only remaining mill of 3 listed in the Doomsday Book and it is well worth a visit. Bourne is steeped in motor racing history with Graham Hill and Jackie Stewart at the wheel of Bourne manufactured race cars for many victories. As an added bonus it is situated on the edge of one of the best walking areas in the district. Bourne Wood.

### MARKET DEEPING

This thriving market town nestles beside the River Welland, alongside the villages of Deeping St James and West Deeping. Collectively known as The Deepings there is a wealth of local history, scenic walks and country pubs to discover. The town hosts popular annual events such as The Deepings Raft Race and annual Duck Race.

## RUTLAND

Just a short drive from Langtoft you will find England's smallest county, which offers charming market towns and delightful villages. Rutland's many attractive villages, set in the wonderful English countryside, are home to picture postcard cottages and traditional country pubs.

At its heart is Rutland Water one of the largest manmade lakes in Europe. Rutland Water is a great place for relaxation, recreation and conservation and has a range of activities, suitable for all ages, being run all year round. Rutland Water offers a multitude of leisure pursuits including water sports, cycling, fishing and bird watching.

# PLACES OF INTEREST

#### LINCOLN CATHEDRAL

Lincoln Cathedral has stood tall over Lincolnshire for nearly 1,000 years. The cathedral was once the tallest building in the world - a guided tour of the roof or tower will not only give you stunning views inside the cathedral but outside across the county too.

### LINCOLN CASTLE

Lincoln's castle was built by William the Conqueror in 1068, dominating the Lincoln skyline and protecting the city for almost one thousand years.

The Victorian and Georgian prisons in the grounds of the Castle give an insight into crime and punishment of the past – including the one-of-a-kind separate system.

### BURGHLEY HOUSE

Located in Stamford, Burghley is one of the largest and grandest houses of the first Elizabethan Age.

Built in the 16th century, the main part of the house has 35 major rooms, more than 80 lesser rooms and numerous halls, corridors, bathrooms and service areas.

As well as exploring the house you can also enjoy beautiful walks around the historic parkland laid out by Capability Brown and still occupied by a herd of fallow deer.

### LINCOLNSHIRE WOLDS

Enjoy walks and treks through hidden valleys, sleepy stone villages and historic market towns in this Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.
